Gold Bar Hall Plans Move Forward

October 30 Meeting Jam-Packed... with Info

At another open meeting held on October 30^{th} , there was a healthy handful of regular attendees (no newcomers) who met to hear about and participate in the progress that's being made on the community hall building project.

Laurie Scott, Project Chair, reported that he and Rodger Davidson, Gold Bar's Community Recreation Coordinator with the City, had met with a few key representatives from City departments. Those representatives are now well aware of and in favor of our initial hall design, including reconfigured site amenities. The City reps indicated there are less restrictions on the possible hall location than was initially thought – good news for the project as a whole. Laurie and Rodger have more meetings planned with various City reps – all committee members and interested persons are welcome.

Also on hand at the October 30th meeting was Wes Sims, project architect, who is very much involved in the process of listening to the experts and non-experts alike in order to refine the hall design and placement of site elements. One of the biggest factors is the re-positioning of the hockey rink which all parties involved agree needs to be moved from the middle of the property. Once the decision is made with regard to its placement, the rest of the design process can really take shape. Mr. Sims invited committee members to continue open discussions regarding the design, and those present provided a lively discussion with ideas and suggestions coming forward in no small number!

Date Set for Community Forum

A Community Forum is being held on Saturday, November 24 at Gold Bar School for the purpose of gaining input from a wider sampling of our community; therefore, all ages are welcome. Since the hall design is only in its beginning stages, we are still seeking input from as many people as possible.
