The architects' design approach addressed the need to "rethink" the hall placement and orientation on the overall property in order to make the best use of ALL features, including the playground, hockey & leisure rinks, etc. It was an exciting evening, and Mr. Sims will continue working on the design in order to fully satisfy our needs and ideas.

In the meantime, community members who have been attending the meetings and workshops since last spring (and even prior to that), will soon convene again to discuss a wide variety of topics from fundraising to environmental building concepts. Being a multi-year project, it will require perseverance from a great number of people to bring this project to fruition.
